<b>EYFS Geography Links 'The World Around Us'</b>	
<b>Nursery</b>	<b>Reception</b>
<p><b>To develop a sense of place</b></p> <p>Children begin by settling into their new classroom. They develop their understanding of a new place and start to explore and learn about their new environment.</p> <p>Children understand where their personal things belong. They know where their peg is, where they can get a drink, snack etc.</p> <p>Children understand the layout of their classroom. They know where to go to access certain resources or find other items of importance. They understand the different carpet names and where they are to be at certain times.</p>	<p><b>To understand the local area in which we live. To start to understand what a map is used for and create a very simple map.</b></p> <p>Children understand that positional language and directions can tell us where to go.</p> <p>Children to understand and talk about the places that they see and visit in their local area. Children to be able to name the place where they live. To look at a simple hand drawn map of a local route and begin to understand how a map is drawn from a 'birds' eye view'.</p> <p>To create simple representations of their own maps to show where an item is within the classroom (x marks the spot)</p>
<p><b>To talk about their home and start to understand that where they live is unique to them.</b></p> <p>Children talk about who lives in their house with them. They learn that everyone's home is different and some families are bigger or smaller than theirs are.</p> <p>Children talk about features their homes may have. Does it have a garden? Does it have steps? How many bedrooms does it have?</p> <p>Children look at pictures of different types of homes and begin to describe what they can see. They make links to their own homes and identify other homes that look similar.</p>	<p>To recognise some environments are different to the one that they live. To begin to understand that some countries are very different to the UK. Look at a cold or polar country (i.e., North Pole) and examine how the weather pattern is different to our winter. To find the country on a simple world map.</p> <p><b>Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in another country. (Desert climate)</b></p> <p>Children to develop understanding of the features of the continent of Africa. To examine pictures of the desert and rainforest and start to understand different key physical features.</p> <p>To talk about the key differences when contrasting a different country to the one we live in. Children can talk about the weather and weather patterns - <i>hot/rain</i> Landscape- <i>desert/ jungle</i> Places where people live- <i>city/ village</i>.</p>
<p><b>To develop an understanding of the weather and its effects</b></p> <p>Children explore 4 different weather conditions. They look at pictures of each one, naming what the weather is and the effect that weather may have on them. Children explore what changes we might have to make when we have certain weather.</p> <p>Children to select different clothes and items we might need to suit different weather conditions.</p>	<p><b>To begin to understand the concept of seasonal change (Autumn)</b></p> <p>Children begin to understand what changes occur when it becomes the season of Autumn. They describe the changes that they can see around them.</p> <p>To begin to understand how Autumn fits into the cycle of the 4 seasons. What these 4 seasons are and the different things they would see and feel within these seasons.</p> <p><b>To further build on understanding of seasonal change (Winter)</b></p>

	<p><b>To begin to recognise the United Kingdom is a country. To begin to recognise some environments are different from their own. (Polar climate)</b></p> <p>Children understand and name the local area that they live in. What it is called and what type of place it is (city/ village etc)</p> <p>To look at a simple map of the world and begin to understand that they live in the UK and where the UK is placed on the map. To begin to find the UK on the map.</p>
